- 1. Must have a CDL Class A license
- 2. Eligible for WS license
- Must become at entry level training provider from the Federal Motor Safety Carrier Assoc
- 4. The ELTP is registration for a location

Principles of Transportation and Logistics/Commercial Driver Operation Fundamentals/Advanced Commercial Drivers -

Student Prerequisites

- 1. Students must turn 18 before January 1 of spring semester
- 2. Students must have a driver's license for 1 year before turning 18.
- 3. Student are responsible for paying for the CDL learner's permit, CDL physical, and DOT drug screening

Course Information

Semester 1

- 1. Classroom instruction will focus on mainly theory.
- 2. The CDL driver's manual will be used as a resource for instruction.
- 3. Students can drive a truck and complete "hands on" training 1 or 2 days per week.
- 4. Students can practice driving in a parking lot and complete skills tests

Semester 2

- 1. Once students turn 18, students will take the learners permit for CDL at the license branch.
- 2. Students must pass a CDL physical and pass the DOT drug screen.
- 3. After obtaining the permit, passing the physical, and passing the drug screen, students will start driving with the instructor on the road.
- 4. The instructor must evaluate each student and document hours behind the wheel.
- 5. Students may attend an embedded WBL experience.

- 6. When the instructor feels like the student is ready to take the CDL Class A test, the student will find a vendor to take the CDL test.
- 7. The instructor will drive with the student to take the Class A CDL test.
- 8. After obtaining the CDL Class A license, the student can attend the embedded WBL daily.
- 9. It is the expectation that the student will take the CDL before May 15th.

Other information

- 1. A truck and trailer are needed before offering the course.
- 2. The truck and trailer must be licensed at the license branch
- 3. Insurance is required for the truck and trailer. Insurance needs to include the instructor and students.
- 4. Limit to 10-12 students per year.
- 5. Semi truck simulators can be purchased to provide extra driving experience for students. Simulators cost around \$90K
