

ICE



Overview

ICE is offered to seniors in each of the Dubois County schools. The purpose of ICE is to aid in developing employability and soft skills in the workplace. There are no prerequisites for ICE but below you will find a list of requirements for ICE applicants.

Requirements

Students interested in ICE must:

- Be a high school senior.
- Have a 90% attendance rate. (missed fewer than 9 days during first semester of junior year)
- Not have a history of behavior concerns that would make an employer question your character and or ability to be a productive employee. (This includes cases of excessive insubordinations, fighting, written referrals by school personnel, etc.)
- Have a reliable means of transportation.
- Have a strong work ethic, strong communication skills, and a desire to learn.
- Be on track for graduation in all other academic classes.

Details

- Students in ICE are in charge of securing a job. The WBL coordinator will aid in helping a student secure a job, however it is ultimately up to the student to have a job at the start of the school year.
- Students must work in a paid job.
- Students must work a minimum of 15 hours per week.
- ICE is 3 periods of the school day
- ICE is a year long course
- Once the school year starts students will not be permitted to change ICE jobs.
- Students whose jobs are terminated for any reason within their control will likely be removed from the ICE class and receive an F for the ICE credits.
- Students in ICE will be required to complete assignments throughout the year and submit online.

Applying for ICE

I will return to your school at a later date. Then you will fill out a form requesting ICE and answer questions pertaining to the class. Once it is verified with your school counselor that you have signed up for ICE and meet all of the requirements previously stated you will officially be enrolled.
