

# Internship

(Work Based Learning)



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## Overview

Internship is also known as Work Based Learning and is offered to seniors in each of the Dubois County schools. Internship acts as a capstone to a student's Career and Technical Education pathway providing a "real world" experience in a career that a student wishes to pursue. Internship is typically year long, arrangements may be made to offer a student experiences in two different career disciplines if desired.

## Requirements

Students interested in Internship must:

- Be a high school senior.
- Have a 95% attendance rate.
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Jasper students need a 3.0 or higher with weighted scale.
- Not have a history of behavior concerns that would make an employer question your character and or ability to be a productive employee. (This includes cases of excessive insubordination, fighting, written referrals by school personnel, etc.)
- Complete an approved advanced course from a CTE program of study, the student's Internship placement must align to their pathway.
- Have a reliable means of transportation.
- Have a strong work ethic, strong communication skills, and a desire to learn.

## Details

- Internships may be unpaid or paid, however in most cases are not paid.
- Internship is typically 2 periods of the school day and year long.
- The Internship coordinator will help line up Internship placements for students. Please note that every effort will be made to make placements, however placements for all students cannot be guaranteed.
- Students may be expected to take part in a "meet and greet" prior to being placed at an Internship site.
- Along with daily participation at the Internship site, students are required to complete assignments online pertaining to the Internship class.
- *\*Students interested in medical career internships must take HOSA at Jasper High School.*
